Rob Bradley's 1963 Triumph TR4

I purchased my TR4 in 1973 at the age of 19. It was my first set of wheels. I was still living at home with my parents and my mother arranged for me to keep it in the garage of an elderly neighbour living next door. After bringing the car home I wasted no time unbolting all the panels to reveal the full extent of damage inflicted by the dreaded tin worm. With only a couple of dozen bolts left holding the body to the chassis I decided to remove them to give better access to both for carrying out repairs. I sent the bodyshell to a panel beater acquaintance to have the sill panels replaced & other major rust areas repaired.

The strip down & rebuild was a great learning experience. I did most of the work myself with the help of a few friends. I even resprayed the car in the old garage with a dirt floor. I had the car registered and back on the road in just over 12 months and it became my daily drive for a number of years with some great stories to tell.

The TR next became the fun car taken for a spin on sunny weekends. Over the years it has received various specification upgrades including, thermatic fan, rear telescopic shock absorbers to replace the standard lever arm type, front & rear sway bars, wire wheels (an option on new cars), overdrive on 3rd & 4th gears (also an option on new cars) and exhaust extractors.

In May 2016 the TR sustained some accident damage and I engaged the services of Gal Smash in Tullamarine to carry out the necessary repairs along with refurbishing the engine bay. Before delivering the TR to Gal Smash, I with the help of a friend, removed the motor & gearbox and sent them both to Geoff Kelly for rebuilding. Geoff is well respected for his expertise with TR performance upgrades. I sourced the required replacement crankshaft (not an easy task). Geoff proceeded with work on the motor including reshaping the combustion chambers, fitting larger forged pistons & sleeves, a cam grind, balancing & more.

Dave Kimpton, the owner of Gal Smash is a friend of one of my mates. Before delivering the TR to him I removed the thick layer of bitumen from the engine bay which another of my friends had ill-advisedly told me to use some years earlier. I also sourced some new inner guards from Rimmer Bros in the UK. The accident damage was repaired and work was carried out refurbishing the engine bay. Dave soon struck up a friendship with me encouraging me to work on the TR. (Dave called it the "customer participation program"). I worked on the chassis doing tasks such as fitting Nolathane suspension bushes. I recall how I asked Dave about some rust showing through near where the sill panels were replaced some years earlier. Dave said I could remove the filler, but was opening a can of worms. I proceeded down that path resulting in the decision that a bare metal restoration was the best way forward.

I now had heaps of work I could do such as paint stripping the body shell and panels cutting & shaping rust repair patches etc. so Dave gave me a key to the panel shop. With the engine bay repainted Dave helped me to install the engine & gearbox and I also kept busy installing the ancillary components. Covid 19 restrictions kept me from working on the TR for a period but Dave continued fabricating & fitting rust repair panels for behind the sills and in the boot floor.





With rust repairs complete panels and body parts were trial fitted and adjustments made to get the required panel gaps. This was a huge task but well worth the effort. Dave continued preparing each panel for paint. Every panel was file finished so there is virtually no body filler. The time put into the rub down and attention to detail between paint coats is far beyond my expectations but born out in the final result. With paint complete I now had a big job ahead refitting all the interior, ancillary components, door fittings, window glass and more. Dave and I worked to tweak the final panel gaps and Dave completed the final buff. There was lots of other work performed and parts sourced that isn't covered here. I'm not looking to complete another restoration to this standard but will be forever grateful to Dave and the crew at Gal Smash for their friendship and a great learning experience. I also greatly appreciate the support and assistance of friends & WDCVC members.

Now it's time to drive & enjoy a great TR4.
