

### Our trip to New Zealand's North Island and the Whangamata Beach Hop - 20 March 2024

The main purpose for our trip was to visit Betty's penfriend of 66 years. The bonus for Werner was the Repco Beach Hop 2024 Classic Car Show. It's a big event held at Whangamata, located at the southern end of the eastern coast of the Coromandel Ranges often referred to as the Paradise Coast.

We arrived St Patrick's day. The Sky Tower was lit up in a beautiful shade of Green. We stayed 3 nights in Auckland city.

Had 2 full days! Went on the "hop on hop off" bus sightseeing tour of the city. Yachts of every description and size in the Harbour. One of our stops, we went to the Motat Museum of transport and Technology. There we saw a working old Melbourne Tram, the Glenferrie Malvern Road. Betty remembered catching a similar tram to work in the 60s.

That evening we walked to the harbour area for dinner, some streets are quite steep, didn't look like it at the time.

Next day we caught the ferry to Waihehe Island, a forty-minute trip. There we went on the Island "hop on hop off" bus tour. The scenery was beautiful! Vineyards, restaurants, olive groves, miles of beautiful white sandy beaches. Some grand homes, magnificent views, lots of rich and famous live there.

That evening we had booked to have dinner at the revolving restaurant in the Sky Tower with magnificent views of Auckland late evening and night lights.

Next day we picked up our Hire Car and headed off to Whangamata, it's about a 3hr drive if you know the way. Took me a little longer.

We got caught up in a classic car traffic jam, at a town called Waihi, where the Beach Hop cars had come to parade through the town. The Repco Beach Hop 2024 Classic Car Show is a 5-day event, and they also visit surrounding towns.

We joined the end of procession on the very slow drive through very winding twisting mountainous roads.

We arrived at Whangamata late that afternoon. Betty's penfriend Margaret and her husband David were thrilled to see us. It had been 14 years since we last saw them. They have a beach house in Whangamata, their home is in Hamilton.

We had a marvellous time catching up on things and did a couple of day trips around the area, lovely scenery, very winding mountainous roads.

Whangamata population is normally 5000 but swells to 100,000 or more with over 1000 classic cars on show during the 5day event. Daily parade of cars through the town, night time cruising up and down main street, great to watch and to get a good dose of exhaust fumes.

Rock'n'roll night saw everyone dressing up in 50's-60's outfits including the children, a lot of fun to watch.

Saturday is the big event! Cars that have registered park in the main street of town for everyone to admire.

Unfortunately, around lunch time it started to rain. Put a big damper on the event and washed out that afternoon.

5 pm at a nearby reserve, was the big raffle draw! 1st prize: a 1966 Ford Mustang. 2nd prize: Harley Davidson Motor Bike.

3rd prize: \$10.000.00 cash. Entry forms were in the event magazine which cost \$5.00. The winners had to be there. They called the winners mobile phone so there were hundreds of silent people standing in the rain hoping their phone would ring, if not answered - re draw.

Sadly, it was the first time in years the main event was washed out. Sunday is was over and everyone was leaving. We stayed 2 more days then we were on our way home.




